

Groupings to 10

Why do it?

You can help your child to practise the addition facts to 10.

What you need:

- Activity card. You can print this or make your own.
- Cardboard.
- A paperclip.

What to do:

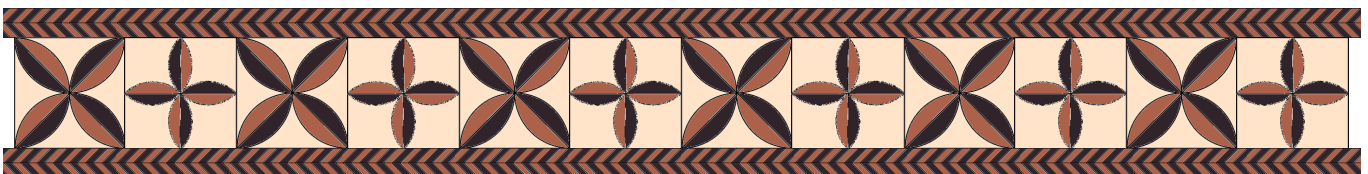
- Glue the activity cards on to cardboard.
- Show your child Activity Card 1 and explain it is ten numbers long.
- Choose a number from the top line and then move the paper clip along that number. For example 4.
- Ask your child to move their finger along the bottom number line until they reach the same point. For example 6.
- Explain that if you move 4 then they need to move 6 to be on the same place.
- Write together the number fact, $4 + 6 = 10$.

What to expect your child to do:

To make pairs of numbers that add up to 10.

Variation:

- When your child can do the activity easily, use Activity Card 2 and ask your child to work out the missing number or each pair.
- Use your home language to do this activity.
- Write out the list of pairs of numbers together.
